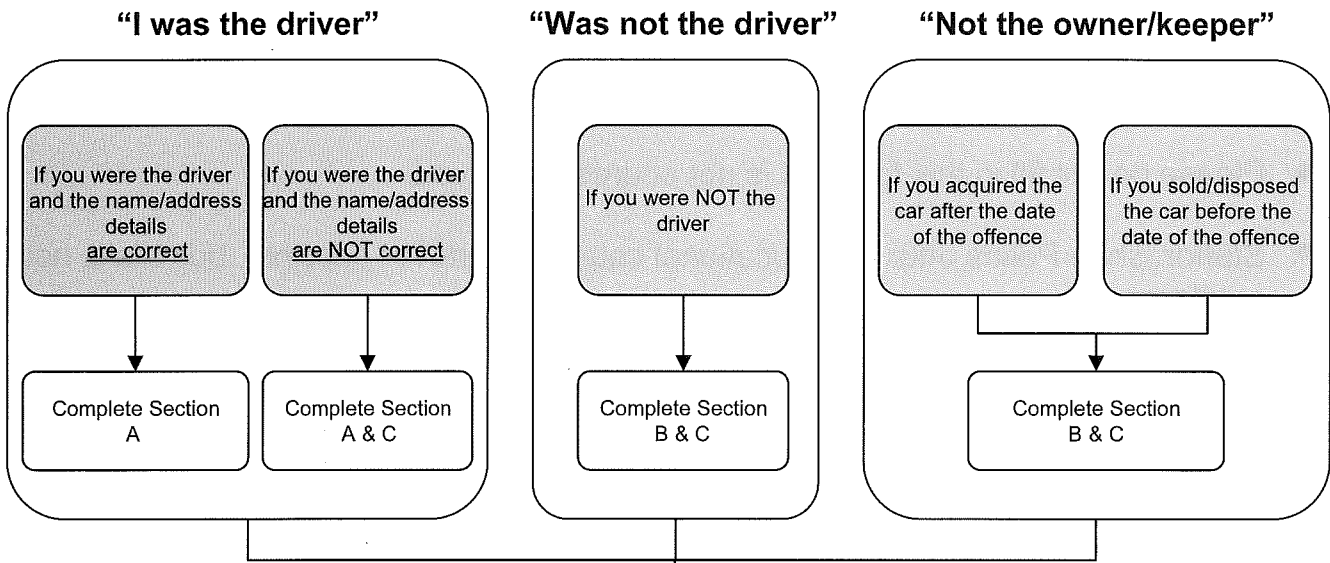


**PLEASE NOTE: This enclosed Notice of Intended Prosecution (NIP) is not a summons**

**A vehicle of which you are the owner / registered keeper / hirer / nominated driver has been detected committing a speeding offence by a Safety Camera.  
This allegation is supported by video / photographic evidence.  
PLEASE SEE FURTHER INFORMATION BELOW AND KEEP THIS LEAFLET FOR YOUR RECORDS.**



**WARNING :** It is a legal requirement under Section 172 of the Road Traffic Act 1988 for the owner/keeper/hirer of the vehicle to supply details of the driver, whether it is themselves or another person. Failure to do so may result in prosecution for a separate offence.

**What happens next?**

**If you were the driver you will be considered for the following options:**

**The Nominated driver will receive a Notice of Intended Prosecution**

*1. Speed Awareness Course*

*2. Conditional Offer*

*3. Proceed to Court*

Pay the course fee then attend the course and receive no points on your licence, or elect to have a conditional offer or to attend court. A course offer is subject to meeting the course criteria and requirements. Current Speed Awareness Course criteria include:

Speed Limit	Offence Speed
20mph	Up to and including 31mph
30mph	Up to and including 42mph
40mph	Up to and including 53mph
50mph	Up to and including 64mph
60mph	Up to and including 75mph
70mph	Up to and including 86mph

You must not have attended the same course nationally in the last 3 years. The current course fee to attend in Staffordshire is £80.

Pay £100 penalty and receive 3 points on your licence, or elect to attend Court

You will be summonsed to go to Court

# Please Note

- You must **complete** and **sign** the notice of intended prosecution.
- Please do not send payment, Driving Licence or any original documents with the Notice of intended prosecution
- When you sign the notice you are saying that the information given is correct.
- You **must not** pass the notice on to anyone to sign for you.
- Please do not fill in this form if it is not addressed to you.
- Staffordshire Police offer an educational course whenever possible, but this is not an entitlement.
- If you are offered a course, some course providers will allow you to pay by instalments.
- Any other issues relating to your vehicle at the time of the offence, for example if the vehicle had been taken without consent (stolen), should have been reported to the police and a note made of any reference numbers given, **please provide this information**.
- Licence number - example OTHER 705117 AN9XP.  
If you have a non-UK.licence please send a copy with your reply.

Please be aware:

Giving the wrong information may lead other offences such as

Permitting no insurance	As the person in charge of a vehicle, if you allow someone to drive it with no insurance cover.
	You may be asked to provide proof of insurance cover for the drive at the time and date of the offence. If you cannot give this you may be charged with the permit no insurance offence, fined a large amount and given six to eight points on your driving licence.
Perverting the course of justice	When you act in a way that in some way stops justice being served on either yourself or on a third party.
	For example, wasting police time. This offence is only heard at the Crown Court and may carry a long prison sentence.
Perjury	This is deliberately giving a false statement which you know to be false or do not believe to be true.
	This offence carries a penalty of 6 months to 2 years imprisonment and/or a fine.
